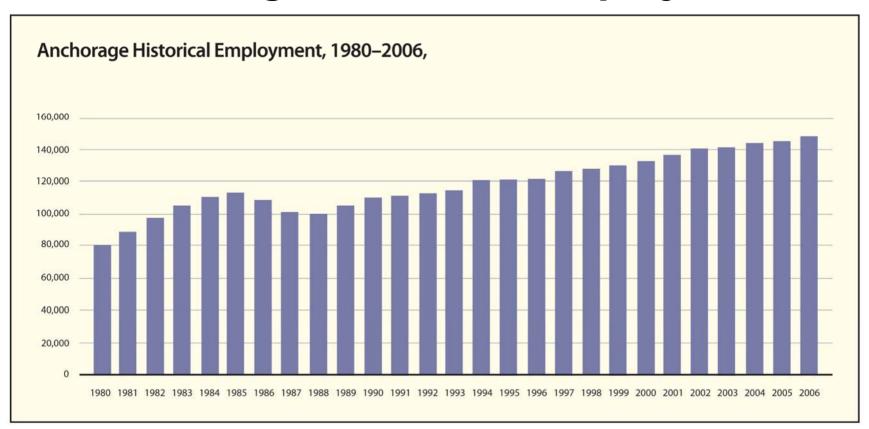

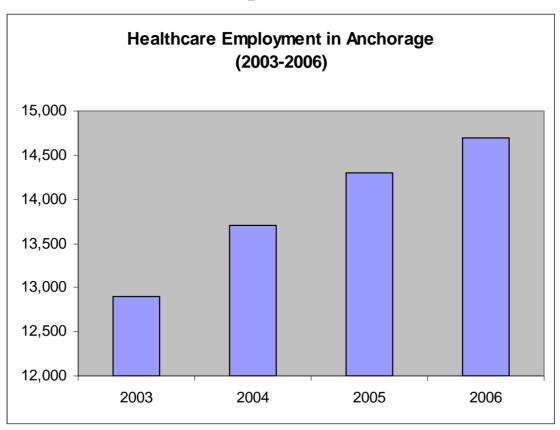
Anchorage Historical Employment







Health Care - Up 340 Jobs in 2007



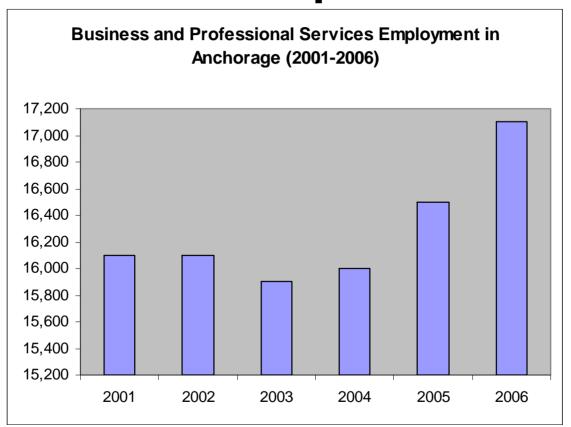


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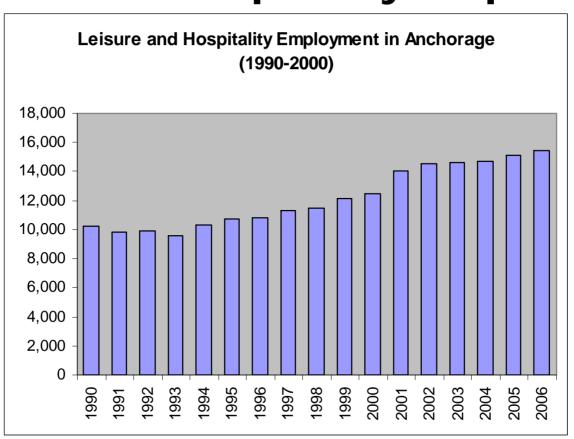

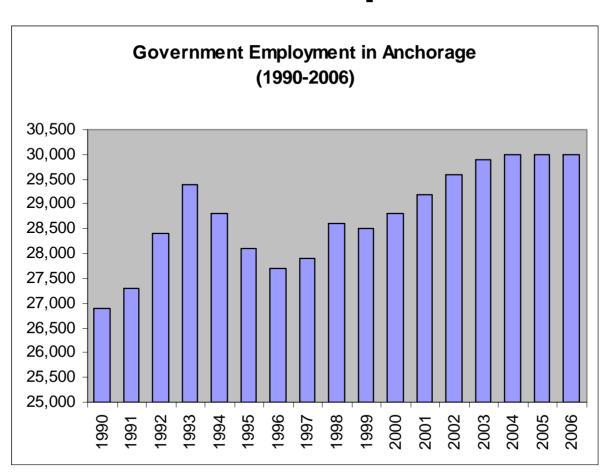

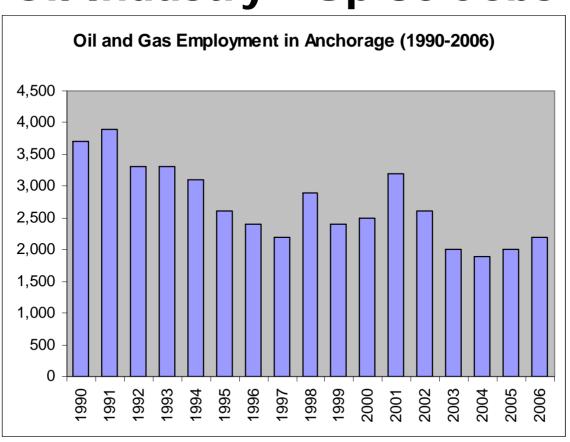

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Construction - Up 40 Jobs

- AEDC predicted no growth in the construction sector in 2007
- Employment is up 0.5%
- Strong commercial construction sector
- Residential construction will continue to decline.



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Other Industries

- Employment increases in transportation (other than air), manufacturing, education, and other miscellaneous services.
- These sectors combined added approximately 440 jobs to the Anchorage economy in the first five months of 2007.

Railbelt Energy: Natural Gas, Crude Oil & Refined products



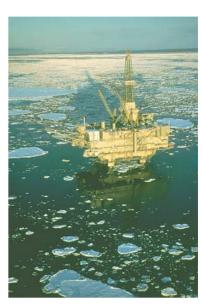


Cook Inlet Natural Gas Pipeline: The Crisis Point is Now

- Gas production peaked in 1996: 223 BCF gas
- 2006 gas production: 197 BCF gas
- 7.3 TCF produced to-date

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- 1.685 TCF remaining proven reserves: 8 years out
- 587 Bcf proven reserves replacement since 2000, or 2.1 year supply added

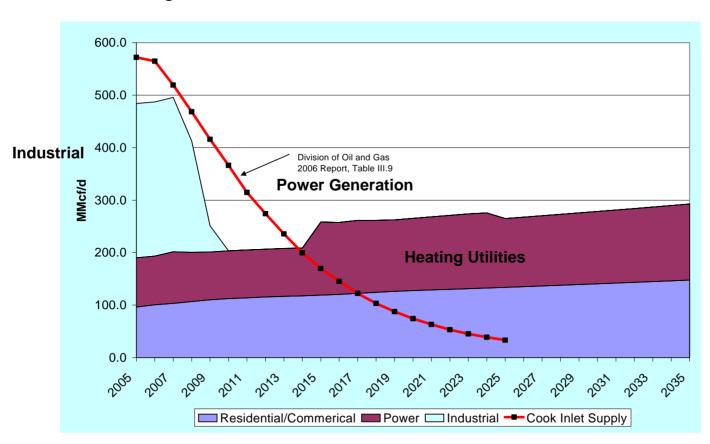

Cook Inlet Crude Oil Supplies: The "Other" Alaska Energy Crisis

- Cook Inlet Oil production peaked in 1972: 90 MMBO
- Cook Inlet Oil production in 2006: 6.1 MMBO
- 1,324 MMB oil, produced to-date

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- 102.5 MMB remaining proven oil reserves
- 51.3 MMB proven reserves replacement since year 2000

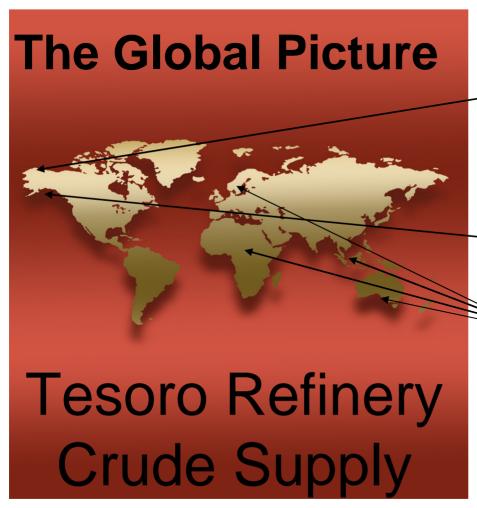

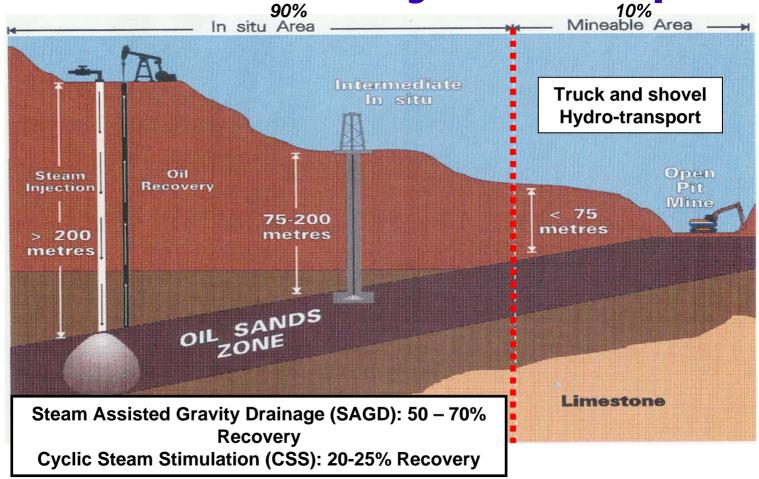
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Oil Sands Recovery Techniques



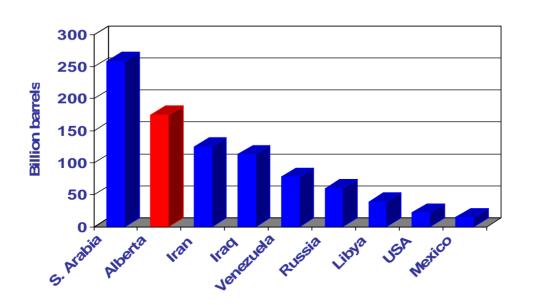


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Ranked as the second largest established oil reserves, after Saudi Arabia.

Alberta Economic Highlights

Canada's fastest growing province:

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- Over the past 20 years, averaged 3.5%/year
- In 2006, Alberta's GDP expanded 6.8% and population reached 3.3 million
- Alberta's total investment in 2005:
 - \$60.3 billion (2006 estimated at \$66 billion)
 - highest investment per capita in Canada
- Lowest overall tax level of any province:
 - 47% lower provincial & municipal taxes
 - Alberta corporate tax rate is 10.0%

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- –1 MBD upgraded to refined products
- 5 MBD bitumen output by 2030
 - –2 MBD upgraded to refined products
- Urgent to capture "window of opportunity" for exporting refined products



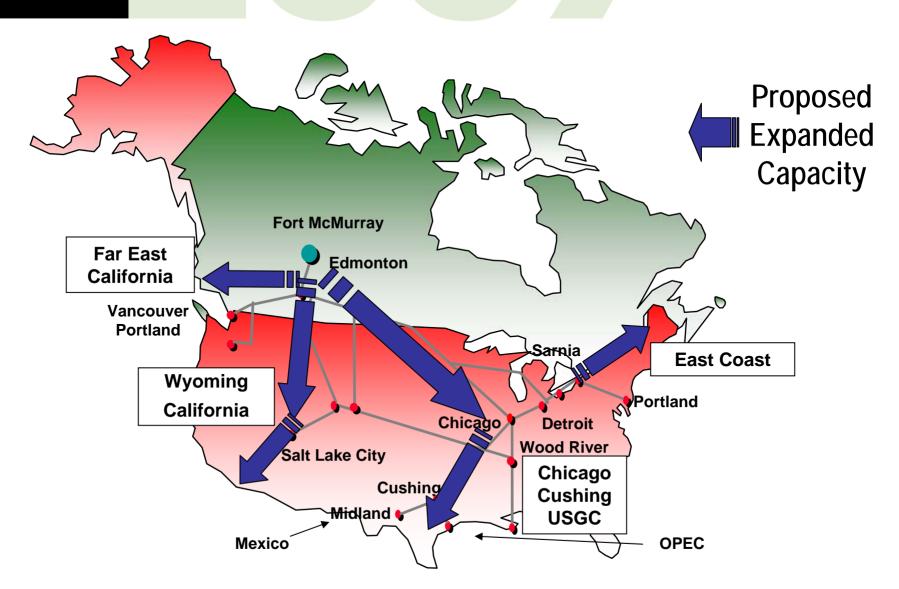
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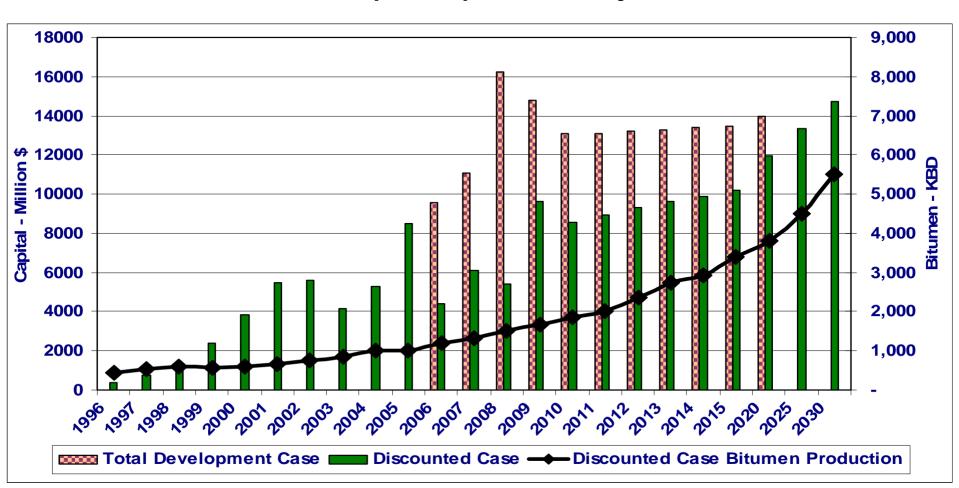








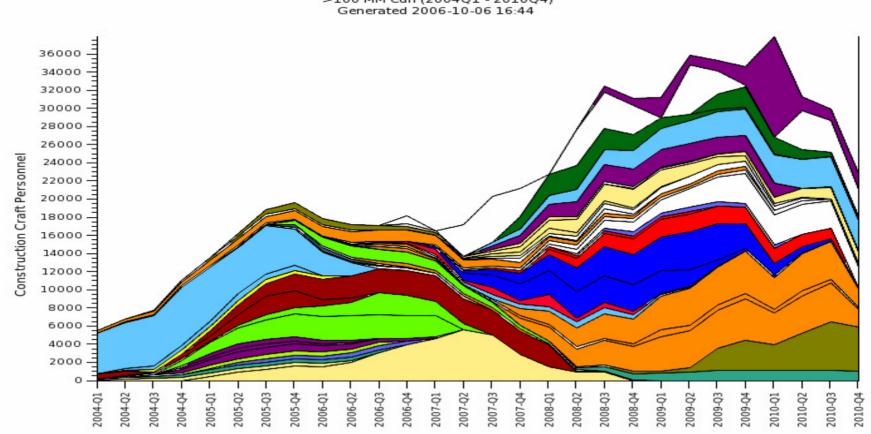
Oil Sands Production and Capital Expenditure Projections with AIH Share
